Un-reimbursed Medical Expense Deductions

\$50,000 - Gross Income -\$15,000 - Deductions \$35,000 - Adjusted Gross Income

- If total un-reimbursed medical expenses exceed 7.5% of <u>Adjusted Gross</u>
 <u>Income</u> the amount that exceeds 7.5% can be deducted.
- In this example, 7.5% of A.G.I. is \$2,625. If the insured had \$10,000 of un-reimbursed expenses the amount that can be deducted would be \$7,375, the amount over \$2,625.
- If at a later time the insurance company does indeed pay these expenses (because of a lawsuit?), the insured must reclaim the amount he deducted (the \$7,375).
- Items that may be added up are prescription drugs, insulin, hospital expenses, nursing care, doctors' fees, dental care, rehabilitative treatments, & medical insurance premiums (including long term care)
